


**Outlander** by Diana Gabaldon

Became a television series.





At the age of twelve an orphan named Will Cooper is given a horse, a key, and a map and is sent on a journey through the uncharted wilderness of the Cherokee Nation.







Set over the course of five decades, The Dutch House is a dark fairy tale about two smart people who cannot overcome their past.






